Righteousness and God's Word

- 1. A great theme in Psalm 119 is God's righteousness
 - a. Fourteen verses contain at least one of three Hebrew words translated as "righteous" or "righteousness"
 - i. righteous (tsaddiq H6662 tsad-deek') Ps. 119:137
 - ii. righteous; right; justice; righteousness (*tsedeq* H6664 tseh´-dek) <u>Ps. 119:7</u>, <u>62</u>, <u>75</u>, <u>106</u>, <u>121</u>, <u>123</u>, <u>138</u>, <u>142</u>, <u>144</u>, <u>160</u>, <u>164</u>, <u>172</u>
 - iii. righteousness (tsedaqah H6666 tsed-aw-kaw') Ps. 119:40, 142
 - b. ~8% of the verses in Psalm 119 use these Hebrew words
 - c. God does not waste time, words or anything else (cf. Jn. 6:12)
- 2. Righteousness is a major theme in the Old Testament
 - a. A combined <u>482 times</u> the three Hebrew words above are used throughout the Old Testament
 - b. God is telling us something as it relates to this important topic
 - c. What can we learn about righteousness from Psalm 119?
 - d. Several themes emerge as we examine these fourteen verses

Righteous Judgments

- The Psalmist plainly states that God's judgments are righteous (<u>Ps. 119:7</u>, <u>62</u>, <u>75</u>, <u>106</u>, <u>137</u>, <u>160</u>, <u>164</u>)
 - a. When we judge are we using God's judgments or our own judgments? (Mt. 7:1-5; Jn. 7:24)
 - i. Prejudice is not proper judgment! (Jm. 2:1-9)
 - b. We are to practice judgment and justice (Ps. 119:121)
 - i. justice (*tsedeq* H6664 tseh´-dek) the quality of conforming to law; conformity to truth, fact, or reason
- 2. Recall that nine synonyms are used for God's Word in Psalm 119
 - a. Law; Testimonies; <u>Judgments</u>; Statutes; God's Word(s); Precepts; Commandments; Promise; Way(s)
 - b. The Psalmist is declaring God's Word as righteous
- 3. God's righteous judgments make God:
 - a. Worthy of praise (<u>Ps. 119:7</u>, <u>164</u>)
 - i. praise = to confess, praise, give thanks (Ps. 119:7)
 - ii. praise = to praise, celebrate, glory, sing (praise), boast (Ps. 119:164)
 - b. Worthy of thanksgiving (Ps. 119:62)
 - i. Can't sleep? Let's pray to God and thank Him for His righteous judgments!

- ii. "In the 17th Century (1601-1700), getting up in the middle of the night was normal. - 4. God's righteous judgments:
 - a. Can be known (Ps. 119:75; Jn. 8:32; 2 Jn. 1-2)
 - b. Must be kept (Ps. 119:106; Jn. 14:15, 15:14)
 - c. Endure forever (Ps. 119:160; Mt. 24:35; 1 Pt. 1:23-25)
 - d. Come from His righteousness (Ps. 119:137)
 - i. upright = straightforward, just
 - ii. Job was described with this word (Job 1:1)

Righteous Testimonies

- 1. Another of the synonyms for God's Word, as found in Psalm 119, is testimonies
 - Testimonies indicate God's Law and serve as a witness to an agreement or covenant
- 2. God's testimonies are:
 - a. Righteous and very faithful (Ps. 119:138)
 - faithful = firm, steadfast, trustworthy
 - ii. God's Word can and must be trusted
 - iii. God is faithful to His promises and so must we be
 - b. Everlasting (<u>Ps. 119:144</u>)
 - i. God's righteousness is everlasting (Ps. 119:142)

Conclusion

- 1. God's righteousness can make us alive (Ps. 119:40)
 - a. Do I long after God's precepts?
 - b. Do I desire salvation and the Word of righteousness intensely? (Ps. 119:123)
 - i. fail = waste away, be exhausted
- 2. Let us speak God's Word to each other and others (Ps. 119:172)
 - a. With so much unrighteousness and injustice in the world, we want God's Word to prevail in righteousness!
 - b. Christ will judge the world in righteousness thus the need to repent and conform to His standard (Acts 17:30-31; cf. Jn. 12:48; Rev. 20:11-15)
