## Introduction

- 1. "<sup>1</sup> God, who at sundry times and in divers manners spake in time past unto the fathers by the prophets, <sup>2</sup> Hath in these last days spoken unto us by *his* Son, whom he hath appointed heir of all things, by whom also he made the worlds;" (<u>Heb. 1:1-2</u>)
  - a. Prophecy was given by God and spoken by holy men (2 Pt. 1:19-21)
  - b. All Scripture is inspired of God (<u>2 Tim. 3:16</u>)
- 2. The Old Testament prophets pointed to the Christ
  - a. In our Bible, the prophets are divided into two sections:
    - i. Major (5 books): Isaiah Daniel
    - ii. Minor (12 books): Hosea Malachi
  - b. The difference is based upon <u>length</u> and not <u>quality</u> of content
- 3. Zechariah came from a family of prophets (Zech. 1:1)
  - a. He lived during the time that the faithful remnant of Judah were coming out of Babylonian captivity after seventy years (cf. Jer. 29:10; Dan. 9:2)
    - i. In total, three waves of Jews returned to their land in the years 536 B.C., 457 B.C., and 444 B.C. (cf. Ezra 2)
  - b. He wrote around 520 B.C.
    - i. "In the eighth month, in <u>the second year of Darius</u>, came the word of the LORD unto Zechariah..." (Zech. 1:1)
    - ii. Darius Hystaspes, the king of Persia, reigned from 522-486 B.C.
  - c. While his focus was on motivating Judah to rebuild the temple and restore worship to God, he also gave glimpses of the coming Messiah

# The BRANCH

- 1. Zechariah records eight visions given to him by God in the first six chapters (Zech. 1-6)
- 2. One of those visions is of Joshua, the high priest (Zech. 3:1-10)
  - a. In this vision, the angel of the LORD speaks to Joshua regarding His servant, the BRANCH (Zech. 3:8)
    - i. BRANCH (*tsemach* H6780 tseh'-makh) a *sprout* (usually concr.), lit. or fig.: branch, bud, that which (where) grew (upon), spring (-ing). (Strong 100)
    - ii. Though Judah had been cut down, there was hope coming through their nation! (cf. Job 14:7; <u>1 Tim. 1:1</u>; <u>2 Tim. 1:1</u>; <u>Titus 1:1-2</u>)
- 3. In a different vision, Zechariah records another prophecy regarding the BRANCH (Zech. <u>6:12-13</u>)
  - a. This is a prophecy about Jesus who would spring forth from Judah through Jesse and David's seed line (<u>Isa. 11</u>; Jer. 23:5-6)
  - b. The BRANCH was going to be a man (Gal. 4:4; Jn. 1:1-3, 14)
    - i. Some deny Christ came in the flesh (<u>1 Jn. 4:3; 2 Jn. 7</u>)
  - c. The BRANCH would build the temple of the LORD ( $\underline{\text{Zech. 6:12-13}}$ )
    - i. A great prophecy of the church, the temple of God (<u>2 Cor. 6:16-18; Eph. 2:19-22;</u> cf. <u>1 Pet. 2:5</u>)

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- ii. God's eyes would be upon this precious stone (Zech. 3:9-10; cf. Mic. 4:1-4)
- d. The BRANCH would be King and Priest at the <u>same time</u> and <u>peace</u> will be between these offices (<u>Zech. 6:13</u>)
  - i. Christ is the great High Priest (<u>Heb. 3:1</u>, <u>4:14</u>)
  - ii. Christ is the KING OF KINGS (Rev. 19:13-16)
  - iii. Christ is the Prince of Peace (<u>Isa. 9:6-7</u>)

### Various Prophecies of the Christ

- 1. Zechariah is replete with various prophecies which were fulfilled in Christ
  - a. Triumphal entry of Christ into Jerusalem (Zech. 9:9; Mt. 21:1-11)
    - i. We need to be meek (Gal. 5:22-23)
  - b. Betrayal price of Jesus and what the money would be used for (Zech. 11:12-13; Mt. 26:14-16, 27:3-10)
    - i. 30 shekels of silver was the price of a servant (Ex. 21:32; cf. Mk. 10:45)
    - ii. 30 shekels of silver = 172.50 today
    - iii. This money was used to purchase the potter's field full of broken, misshapen, and marred vessels (<u>Mt. 27:10</u>)
    - iv. We are remade new in Christ (<u>2 Cor. 5:17</u>)
  - c. Piercing of Jesus (Zech. 12:10; Jn. 19:34, 37; Rev. 1:7)
    - i. Two precious elements flowed from Jesus: blood and water (cf. <u>1 Jn. 5:8</u>)
  - d. Striking of the Shepherd (Zech. 13:7; Mt. 26:31, 56)
    - i. Let us not forsake God! (<u>Heb. 13:5-6</u>)

# **A Fountain Opened**

- 1. One of Zechariah's most powerful prophecies comes to us in Zech. 13:1
- 2. The precious blood of Jesus Christ cleanses sin (cf. <u>1 Jn. 1:7</u>)
  - a. Where is this blood and where can I contact it?
    - i. Remember what flowed from Jesus' side when the soldier pierced him? Water <u>and</u> blood
    - ii. The blood is in the water
  - b. "And from Jesus Christ, *who is* the faithful witness, *and* the first begotten of the dead, and the prince of the kings of the earth. Unto him that loved us, and <u>washed us from our</u> <u>sins in his own blood</u>," (Rev. 1:5)
  - c. "And now why tarriest thou? arise, and <u>be baptized</u>, and <u>wash away thy sins</u>, calling on the name of the Lord." (<u>Acts 22:16</u>)
  - d. "...were <u>saved by water</u>.<sup>21</sup> The like figure whereunto *even* <u>baptism doth also now save</u> <u>us..." (1 Pt. 3:20-21)</u>
  - e. One must be born again to enter into the kingdom of God (Jn. 3:1-5; cf. Eph. 5:25-27; 1 Cor. 12:13; Titus 3:5)
