Great

- 1. Definition
 - a. An adjective that reflects an abundance of something
 - b. Young's Literal Translation reads, "Abundant peace have those loving Thy law, And they have no stumbling-block."
 - c. No small amount of peace is mentioned here

Peace

- 1. *shalom* (<u>Ps. 119:165</u>)
 - a. 237 times in the Bible is this Hebrew word found
 - b. The word is translated as "peace" (173), "well" (11), "peaceable/peaceably" (11), "welfare" (5), "prosperity/prosperous" (5), "salute/saluted" (4), and "safe/safely" (2) to name the most common occurrences
- 2. Peace as found in the Psalms and Proverbs
 - a. The LORD blesses His people with peace (Ps. 29:11)
 - b. Peace must be sought after (<u>Ps. 34:14</u> cited in <u>1 Pt. 3:11</u>)
 - c. The meek delight in the abundance of peace (<u>Ps. 37:11</u> cited in <u>Mt. 5:5</u>)
 - d. End of the perfect and upright person is peace ($\underline{Ps. 37:37}$)
 - i. "...For there is a *happy* end to the man of peace." (ASV)
 - e. God speaks peace to His people (<u>Ps. 85:8</u>)
 - f. Righteousness and peace are close enough to kiss (<u>Ps. 85:10</u>)
 - g. Wisdom's paths are peace (<u>Pr. 3:17</u>)
 - h. Peace brings joy (<u>Pr. 12:20</u>)
- 3. Christ is the Prince of Peace
 - a. In fulfillment (<u>Lk. 1:79, 2:11-14; Eph. 2:11-17; Col. 1:20; Rm. 5:1-2</u>)
 - b. In instruction (<u>Mt. 5:9; Mk. 9:50</u>)
 - i. Golden rule (Mt. 7:12)
 - ii. Sadly, some will not believe and obey and lack of peace follows (<u>Mt. 10:34-39</u>; cf. <u>Lk. 12:51-53</u>)
 - c. In promise (<u>Jn. 14:27-28</u>, <u>16:33</u>)
- 4. New Testament Peace
 - a. The gospel of peace (<u>Acts 10:34-43; Rm. 10:15</u>)
 - i. Fruit of righteousness is sown in peace (Jm. 3:18)
 - b. Peace is part of the prize (<u>Rm. 2:1-16</u> esp. <u>Rm. 2:10</u>)
 - i. As a Christian, you can have peace <u>now</u> and <u>later</u>!
 - c. To be spiritually minded is life and peace $(\underline{Rm. 8:6})$

- d. As much as possible, we should live peaceably with others (<u>Rm. 12:18</u>)
- e. The kingdom of God (church) is righteousness, peace, and joy (<u>Rm. 14:17-19</u>)
 i. Must follow (pursue) after peace (<u>Rm. 14:19</u>)
- f. God is of peace (<u>1 Cor. 14:33</u>)
- g. We should live in peace (<u>2 Cor. 13:11</u>)
- h. Peace is one of the character traits which makes up the fruit of the Spirit (<u>Gal.</u> 5:22)
- i. Peace upon them that walk, "according to this rule" (Gal. 6:16)
 - i. rule (*kanon* G2583 kan-ohn') indicates a "a straight rod," used as a ruler or measuring instrument (Vine 496)
 - ii. "In general the word thus came to serve for anything regulating the actions of men, as a standard or principle." (Vine 496)
- j. Feet shod with, "the preparation of the gospel of peace" (Eph. 6:15)
- k. Peace of God keeps (guards) our hearts and minds through Christ (Phil. 4:4-9)

Have They Which Love Thy Law

- 1. Great peace comes to those who <u>love</u> God's Law
 - a. love (*ahab* H157 aw-hab') basically this verb is equivalent to the English "to love" in the sense of having a strong emotional attachment to and desire either to possess or to be in the presence of the object (Vine 141)
 - b. This same word is used in <u>Dt. 6:5</u>
 - c. It is a love that is shown (1 Jn. 4:7-11)
 - d. If I love God's Law, it will be shown in my attitude and behavior toward it

Conclusion

- 1. If we love God's Law not only will we have great peace but nothing shall offend or cause us to stumble
 - a. Our stumbling occurs when our love for God's Law wanes
 - b. Our stumbling occurs when we fail to take heed (1 Cor. 10:12)
 - c. If we practice the Christian graces in our lives we shall never fall, and Heaven awaits us (<u>2 Pt. 1:10-11</u>)
- 2. If we are on the Lord's side who can be against us? (<u>Rm. 8:31</u>)
- 3. Let us spread the glorious gospel message of peace and bring peace to others as we continue to enjoy it in our lives!
