Introduction

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# Conversion describes the action of "turning about" or "turning towards" (<u>Acts 26:18-</u>20; cf. Acts 9:32-35, 11:21, 14:15)

- a. John the Immerser would turn (convert) many of the children of Israel to the Lord as the forerunner of Christ (cf. <u>Lk. 1:16-17</u>)
- No longer am I going to be a child of the devil but a child of God (<u>Rm. 6:16</u>; cf. <u>1 Jn.</u> <u>3:10</u>)
  - a. At the moment of conversion, the allegiance of the convert changes <u>from</u> Satan <u>to</u> God
  - b. Satan will not take this lightly (<u>1 Pt. 5:8-9</u>)
  - c. Staying converted becomes my life's work as I strive to do the will of God and help others do the same (<u>Mt. 7:21-27</u>)

## **Take Heed to Yourself**

- 1. Self-examination is essential (2 Cor. 13:5)
  - a. False gods and deities are not the standard, God is (Mt. 5:48; Eph. 5:1)
  - b. Other people are not the standard, Jesus Christ is (<u>Rm. 8:29; 1 Jn. 2:6</u>)
  - Man's philosophies, ideologies, and sophistries are not the standard, the Word of God is (<u>Phil. 3:13-16</u>; cf. <u>Gal. 6:14-16</u>; Jm. 1:21-25, 2:12)
  - d. This is a <u>daily</u> task (<u>Acts 17:10-11</u>)
    - i. The result of searching the Scriptures is conversion (<u>Acts 17:12</u>; cf. <u>Acts</u> <u>16:25-34</u>)
  - e. I must be growing or I am dying (<u>2 Pt. 3:18</u>; cf. <u>1 Pt. 2:2</u>)
- 2. Self-control is commanded (<u>1 Cor. 9:24-27</u>)
  - a. Begins with the mind (<u>2 Cor. 10:3-5</u>)
- 3. Self-love is lawful (<u>Mt. 22:39</u>; cf. <u>Rm. 13:9</u>; <u>Gal. 5:14</u>; <u>Jm. 2:8</u>)
  - a. We need some down time ( $\underline{Mk. 6:31}$ )
  - b. We need some time with God alone (Mt. 14:23)
  - c. We show our love to God and thus our own souls in keeping His commandments (Jn. 14:15)

## **Take Heed to The Doctrine**

- 1. Doctrine must be sound (<u>Titus 2:1</u>; cf. <u>2 Tim. 1:13</u>)
  - a. doctrine (*didaskalia* G1319 did-as-kal-ee'-ah) *instruction* (the function or the information):—doctrine, learning, teaching (Strong 23)
  - b. sound (*hygiaino* G5198 hoog-ee-ah'ee-no) to *have* sound *health*, i.e. *be well* (in body); fig. to be *uncorrupt* (*true* in doctrine):—be in health, (be safe and) sound, (be) whole (-some). (Strong 73)
  - c. Paul left Titus in Crete to set things in order (<u>Titus 1:5</u>)

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- d. Doctrine is sound if it is book, chapter, and verse rightly divided [taught accurately] (<u>2 Tim. 2:15</u>)
- e. The Old Testament is written for our learning [didaskalia] (<u>Rm. 15:4</u>)
- 2. Pay attention to what is being taught (<u>Acts 17:10-11</u>)
  - a. Not everyone teaches the truth (<u>Mt. 7:15-20;</u> cf. <u>1 Tim. 4:1-3;</u> <u>2 Tim. 2:16-18</u>)
- 3. Pay attention to what you are teaching (1 Tim. 4:13)
  - a. Desire may be present but so must be understanding (<u>1 Tim. 1:5-7</u>; cf. <u>2 Tim. 3:1-</u> <u>8</u>)
  - b. Put in the work and make sure it is correct before it is taught (Jm. 3:1)
  - c. Not only is my conversion, but other's conversions are at stake! (<u>2 Tim. 4:1-5</u>; cf. <u>1 Cor. 9:27</u>)

### **Continue In Them**

- Staying converted means continuing to allow God's Word to transform my life (<u>Rm.</u> <u>12:1-3</u>)
  - a. Conversion <u>begins</u>, not ends, at baptism (<u>Acts 2:38</u>, <u>3:19</u>)
- 2. God wants us to stay converted which implies it is possible to turn back to the world
  - a. Demas did (<u>Col. 4:14; Phm. 24; 2 Tim. 4:10</u>)
    - i. Why? He did not love God, others, or himself; he loved this present world
    - ii. Why? He was not grounded and settled in the faith (<u>Col. 1:23</u>)
    - iii. Why? He did not keep himself in the love of God (Jude 21)
    - iv. Why? He did not take heed to himself or the doctrine (<u>1 Tim. 4:16</u>)
- 3. Daily exhortation is essential for staying converted (Heb. 3:12-13)

## Conclusion

- 1. One who stays converted distances themselves from  $sin(\underline{Rm. 6:1-4})$ 
  - a. The opposite of being converted is continuing in sin
  - b. A fully converted person is dead to sin and alive to God (<u>Rm. 6:11</u>)
- 2. Take heed to yourself
  - a. You must work out your own salvation (conversion) with fear and trembling (<u>Phil.</u> <u>2:12</u>)
- 3. Take heed to the doctrine
  - a. What I believe and teach directly impacts my conversion and others
- 4. Continue in them
  - a. Keep examining self, practice self-control, and love of God, others, and self
