Introduction

- 1. Society is growing weaker in mind
- 2. God, in His infinite wisdom, saw fit to give mankind His Holy Bible
 - a. Holy, because it comes from the Holy One (Isa. 57:15)
 - b. Bible, because it is not just a book, it is the Book of books making one complete to everything good (2 Tim. 3:16-17)
- 3. In giving us a book:
 - a. God requires us to read the Holy Scriptures
 - b. Good results will come to those who read and apply the Holy Bible

The Requirement to Read

- 1. The king of Israel was required to read the law (Dt. 17:18-20)
 - a. Those who lead need to know the law so they can teach, exhort, and convict those who contradict (<u>1 Tim. 3:2</u>; <u>Titus 1:9</u>)
- 2. The Levites were required to read to the people (Dt. 31:9-13)
 - a. Those who serve need to know the law (1 Tim. 3:9)
- 3. Timothy was required to give attention to reading (1 Tim. 4:13)
 - a. Those who teach need to know the law (<u>1 Tim. 1:5-7</u>; <u>2 Tim. 3:7</u>)
- 4. Local congregations of the church were required to read letters from the apostles
 - a. Colossians and Laodiceans (Col. 4:16; cf. Rev. 3:14-22)
 - b. Thessalonians (<u>1 Th. 5:27</u>)
 - c. Seven churches of Asia (Rev. 1:3)

The Results of Reading

- 1. Revelation from God (Eph. 3:1-7)
 - a. God wants us to understand His will (Eph. 5:17)
 - i. He has revealed His will completely (Rm. 12:2; Jm. 1:25)
- 2. Reverence toward God (Neh. 8:5-6; cf. Dt. 31:12-13)
- 3. Remorse for sin (Neh. 8:7-11)
 - a. King Josiah showed remorse and repentance after the law was read (2 Kgs. 22:8-11; cf. 2 Kgs. 22:1-23:25)
- 4. Rejoicing for understanding and obeying (Neh. 8:12-18)
 - a. The Ethiopian eunuch understood, obeyed the Gospel, and rejoiced (<u>Acts</u> 8:26-39)

Conclusion

- 1. Reading of God's Word is required by God
- 2. Reading of God's Word produces results
 - a. It provides God's revelation
 - b. It produces reverence toward God
 - c. It produces remorse and repentance due to sin
 - d. It produces rejoicing
