Introduction

- 1. Joseph was the first son of Jacob and Rachel (Gen. 30:22-24)
 - a. Jacob worked hard for Rachel (Gen. 29:18-30)
 - i. Fourteen years for her (and Leah) and six years for Laban's flock (Gen. 31:41)
 - b. Joseph was the son of Jacob's old age and was shown favoritism (<u>Gen.</u> <u>37:3</u>)
 - i. This bred resentment with his brothers (Gen. 37:4)
 - ii. Joseph also contributed to the resentment (Gen. 37:5-11)
 - c. Joseph was sold into Egyptian slavery by his brothers due to their envy (Gen. 37:12-36)
- 2. Joseph will serve as our next example of reverence
 - a. Joseph's prosperity
 - b. Joseph's purity
 - c. Joseph's power
 - d. Preservation of Jacob's posterity through providence

I. Joseph's Prosperity

- 1. God prospered Joseph on multiple occasions
 - a. With Potiphar (Gen. 39:1-6)
 - b. With the keeper of Pharaoh's prison (Gen. 39:23)
- 2. Stephen confirms the Old Testament record (Acts 7:9-10)

II. Joseph's Purity

- 1. Joseph fled from fornication maintaining his purity (Gen. 39:6-15)
 - a. Fleeing fornication is what we all must do (1 Cor. 6:15-20; 1 Th. 4:3-5)

- i. Fornication should not be named among us as saints (Eph. 5:3; Col. 3:5)
- ii. Fornication is a work of the flesh (Gal. 5:19)
- iii. Begins with looking and lusting (Mt. 5:28)
- iv. The sexual relationship is reserved for marriage only (Heb. 13:4)
- 2. Look at Joseph's reverence (Gen. 39:9)
 - a. God sees all (<u>Pr. 5:15-23</u>)

III. Joseph's Power

- 1. After Joseph interpreted Pharaoh's dream, he rose to power in Egypt (Gen. 41:37-44)
- 2. Before honor is humility (Pr. 15:33)
 - a. Let us humble ourselves and let God do the exalting in due time (1 Pt. 5:6)

IV. Preservation of Jacob's Posterity through Providence

- 1. God's providence preserved a posterity for the children of Israel (Gen. 45:1-8)
 - a. This was necessary to fulfill the promise made to Abram (Gen. 12:1-3)
- 2. God's providence ultimately brought about the Messiah (Gen. 49:8-12)
 - a. God, through providence, brought about good (<u>Gen. 50:15-21</u>; <u>Rm. 8:28-30</u>)

Conclusion

- 1. Joseph is an excellent example of reverence
 - a. The LORD greatly prospered him as he was with the LORD
 - b. He maintained his purity during temptation
 - c. God caused him to rise to power which was used to preserve his family
- 2. God is with the reverent (Heb. 13:5-6)
