## Introduction

- 1. The first Divine institution God established was the home (Gen. 2:18-25)
  - a. A home begins at marriage when one man and one woman are joined together by God for one lifetime (Mt. 19:4-6; 1 Cor. 7:39)
  - b. A godly home has God at its center (Ps. 127)
- 2. Within the home, God has provided clear roles for the husband and wife
  - a. To reverence God, we must reverence His roles for the home

## I. The Role of the Husband

- 1. The husband is the head of the home (Eph. 5:23)
  - a. God gave him rule over the wife (Gen. 3:16)
  - b. If the husband is to rule, and he is, then he has the role of leader of the home (<u>Gen. 18:19</u>; <u>Jos. 24:15</u>)
  - c. God took a rib out of Adam's side to make woman (Gen. 2:21-23)
    - i. He did not take a bone out of his head such that the woman would rule over him, nor did he take one from his foot such that he would trample on her
    - ii. Husband and wife are to walk side-by-side through life
- 2. The husband must love his wife (Eph. 5:25)
  - a. This is the highest form of love which is shown by Christ who gave Himself for the church
    - i. He purchased her with His own blood (Acts 20:28)
  - b. This love seeks out the greatest benefit for the recipient
    - i. Husbands, what greater display of love than helping our wives get to Heaven?
    - ii. A wife is a blessing from the LORD (Pr. 18:22)
  - c. The husband ought to love his wife as his own body (Eph. 5:28)
    - i. This gets back to the idea of "one flesh" (Eph. 5:31)
    - ii. This eliminates the abusive husband
  - d. The husband must nourish and cherish his wife as the Lord does the church (Eph. 5:29)
    - i. Nourish means to provide food and to maintain and support (1 Tim. 5:8)
    - ii. Cherish means to foster with tender care
    - iii. The husband takes care of his body, so he is to take care of his wife
- 3. The husband is to dwell with his wife with understanding and give her honor (1 Pt. 3:7)
  - a. If both spouses have an understanding of God's Word, then the marriage is greatly benefitted (<u>Pr. 19:14</u>, <u>27:17</u>)
  - b. Honor has to do with value, esteem, and dignity which comes with wisdom and understanding (<u>Pr. 8:12-18</u>)
    - i. A virtuous wife's worth is far above rubies (Pr. 31:10)
    - ii. The gueen of Sheba learned the value of wisdom (1 Kgs. 10:10; Pr. 20:15)

- c. Husbands, we must treat our wives this way
  - i. It has a direct impact on our prayer life
  - ii. Hindered means to cut into or impede one's course by cutting his way off
- d. In the Christian home we are joint heirs of the grace of life which is eternal life (cf. <u>1 Pt.</u> <u>1:3-9</u>; <u>Titus 1:2</u>, <u>3:7</u>)

## II. The Role of the Wife

- 1. The wife is to be in subjection to her husband (Eph. 5:22; Col. 3:18)
  - a. Submit means to subordinate or to obey
    - i. God's chain of authority (1 Cor. 11:3)
    - ii. This requirement was established early in history and is not based upon culture (Gen. 3:16)
    - iii. The submission to the husband is "as to the Lord" (Eph. 5:22) and "as is fitting [proper] in the Lord" (Col. 3:18)
    - iv. Christians submit to one another in the fear of God (Eph. 5:21)
  - b. Submission is motivated by love (Eph. 5:24; cf. Titus 2:4)
    - i. The church loves Christ and because we love Him we obey Him (Jn. 14:15, 21, 23)
    - ii. This same principle is practiced by the wife toward her husband
    - iii. What if my husband does not obey the word, should I submit to him? Yes! (<u>1 Pt. 3:1-6</u>)
- 2. The wife is to respect or reverence her husband (Eph. 5:33)
  - a. Respect is the same idea as reverence
  - b. A lack of respect can cause one to become a contentious [brawling, quarrelsome] wife (Pr. 19:13, 21:9, 19, 27:15-16)
  - c. A virtuous wife respects not only her husband, but God (Pr. 31:10-31)
    - i. She is "priceless" (<u>Pr. 31:10</u>)
    - ii. She is trustworthy (Pr. 31:11)
    - iii. She does good (Pr. 31:12)
    - iv. Her husband is respected (Pr. 31:23)
    - v. She is thrifty (Pr. 31:24)
    - vi. She is wise and kind (Pr. 31:26)
    - vii. She fears the LORD (Pr. 31:30)

## Conclusion

- 1. Within the home, God has established clear roles for both husbands and wives
  - a. The husband is the head of the home, he is to love his wife, and give honor to her
  - b. The wife is to be submissive to her husband, and show reverence toward him
- 2. At the center of every godly home is the fear of the LORD
  - a. Let us be those that respect God's roles!
