Introduction

- 1. A home is established when God joins together one man and one woman for one lifetime (Mt. 19:4-6)
 - a. When husband and wife come together in the marriage bed, children enter into the home (Heb. 13:4; Gen. 1:28)
 - b. The husband, now also a father, is to bring his children up in the training and admonition of the Lord (Eph. 6:4)
 - c. The wife, now also a mother, assists the father in bringing up the children (Pr. 1:8; 2 Tim. 1:5, 3:14-15)
 - d. If parents live long enough, their children may start their own home and be blessed with their own children (<u>Gen. 5:3-7</u>)
 - e. Now the husband and father become a grandfather and the wife and mother become a grandmother
- 2. The Bible provides us with instruction as it relates to grandparents
 - a. Truly, God has not left us without instruction on anything that we need (2 Pt. 1:3)
 - b. When grandparents fear the LORD, the home is benefitted
 - c. An examination of grandparents and their position in the home is in order

I. A Position of Honor

- 1. The silver-haired head is a crown of glory (Pr. 16:31)
- 2. Grandchildren are the crown of old men (Pr. 17:6)
- 3. There is splendor [beauty; honor] in the gray head (Pr. 20:29)
- 4. Honor the presence of an old person (Lev. 19:32)

II. A Position of Influence

- 1. Grandparents must influence their grandchildren for good (Ps. 71:17-18)
 - a. Good fruit can still be borne in old age (Ps. 92:12-15)
 - b. Consider Job (<u>Job 42:16-17</u>)
 - c. Consider Timothy (2 Tim. 1:5, 3:14-15; Php. 2:19-22)
- 2. Grandparents must not influence their grandchildren for evil
 - a. Unfaithfulness does not take long (Jdg. 2:7-10)

b. The idolatrous Israelites influenced their grandchildren wickedly (<u>2 Kgs.</u> <u>17:24-41</u>)

III. A Position of Responsibility

- 1. A grandparent must be a responsible steward (Pr. 13:22)
 - a. An inheritance is more than just money and possessions
 - b. What greater gift can we leave our grandchildren with then exposing them to the gospel of Jesus Christ?
- 2. Grandparents are in an excellent position to teach which makes them responsible to do so (Dt. 4:1-10)
 - a. This protects against stubbornness and rebellion for future generations (Ps. 78:1-8)
 - b. The older must teach the younger (Tt. 2:1-8)
