Introduction

- 1. The powerful prophecy of <u>Isaiah 62:1-2</u> finds its fulfillment in <u>Acts 11:26</u> when, after the first Gentile converts were added to the church, the disciples were called by God Christians first in Antioch
 - a. The next time we see the name "Christian", is when Paul stood trial before King Herod Agrippa II, when the king declared, "...You almost persuade me to become a Christian." (Ac. 26:28 NKJV)
 - b. The last occurrence of the name "Christian" is seen in our text and connected with suffering and glorifying God (<u>1 Pt. 4:16</u>)

I. The Name "Christian" Contains the Name of Christ

- 1. Christ (Greek term) is equivalent to Messiah (Hebrew term) which means "anointed one" (Jn. 1:41, 4:25)
 - a. Three offices required anointing under the Law of Moses: priest, prophet, and king (Ex. 28:41; 1 Kgs. 19:16)
- 2. While Christ was on Earth, the term used to describe those that adhered to His teachings was "disciples" (learners) of Christ (Ac. 11:26; cf. Jn. 1:37)
 - a. Learning from the Father, brings one to Christ (Jn. 6:44-45)
 - b. Christians are connected with being learners of Christ (Mt. 11:28-30)
- 3. Christ is the only name connected with salvation (Ac. 4:10-12)

II. The Christian Shares in the Sufferings of Christ (1 Pt. 4:12-19)

- This makes sense as Christians are members of Christ's body, the church (<u>1</u> <u>Pt. 5:14</u> "in Christ Jesus")
 - a. Those that Peter addressed were born again (1 Pt. 1:3, 23; cf. Jn. 3:3-5)
 - b. The <u>only</u> place we can glorify God is in the church that belongs to His Son (<u>Eph. 3:21</u>)
 - c. The church is the house [family] of God (<u>1 Pt. 4:17</u>; <u>1 Tim. 3:15</u>)
 - d. The church is God's moral culture in the midst of an immoral world
 - e. The church <u>must</u> be those that obey the gospel of God
 - f. There is suffering connected with sin (<u>1 Pt. 4:15</u>), but there is no glory in that (<u>1 Pt. 2:19-20</u>)

- 2. To get to it [Heaven] we must go through it [suffering]
 - a. Difficulty will be present for the Christian, but we can endure through it

III. The Christian is One That Follows Christ (1 Pt. 2:21-25)

- 1. Christ is the Chief Shepherd (<u>1 Pt. 5:4</u>), and Christians are His sheep (<u>Jn. 10:1-</u> 30)
- 2. Following Christ is a daily task (Lk. 9:23-26)
- 3. Christ always did those things that pleased the Father (Jn. 8:29)
- 4. Christ <u>always</u> sought to do the will of the Father (<u>Jn. 6:38</u>)
- 5. Christ learned obedience through the things which He suffered (Heb. 5:8-9)
- 6. Christ placed the trust of His spirit in God's hands (Lk. 23:46)
