## Introduction

- 1. After David died, his son Solomon took the throne of the united kingdom of Israel (1 Kgs. 2:10-12)
  - a. Solomon was known for his great wisdom (1 Kgs. 4:32-34)
  - b. Solomon was also known as the one who built the temple (1 Kgs. 6:14)

## I. The Fear of the LORD and Wisdom

- 1. After Solomon offered a thousand burnt offerings in Gibeon, God appeared to him in a dream with a question (<u>1 Kgs. 3:4-5</u>)
  - a. Almighty God is the one doing the asking (Ps. 33:6-9)
- 2. Solomon asked for wisdom (1 Kgs. 3:6-9)
  - a. This is evidence of the fear of the LORD (Pr. 1:7, 9:10)
  - b. We are told to ask for wisdom from God when we are lacking it (Jm. 1:5)
  - c. God was pleased with Solomon's answer (1 Kgs. 3:10)
  - d. If the fear of the LORD was lacking, then Solomon's answer would have been different (1 Kgs. 3:11)
    - i. Those that fear the LORD understand life is brief and seek wisdom (Ps. 90:10-12)
    - ii. Those that fear the LORD understand riches are not to be trusted and are fleeting (Pr. 11:28, 23:4-5; cf. Lk. 12:15)
    - iii. Those that fear the LORD let God take vengeance on their enemies (<u>Ps.</u> 94:1; <u>Rm. 12:19</u>)
- 3. God granted Solomon's request (<u>1 Kgs. 3:12</u>)
  - a. God blesses those that fear Him (1 Kgs. 3:13; Ps. 115:12-13)
  - b. Some blessings are conditional (1 Kgs. 3:14)
- 4. The wisdom of God produces fear (1 Kgs. 3:16-28)

## II. The Fear of the LORD and the Temple

- 1. Preparation (1 Kgs. 5)
  - a. Solomon's father, David, had already made abundant preparations for the temple before his death (1 Ch. 22:1-5)
  - b. Part of that preparation was charging Solomon with building the temple (1 Ch. 22:6-16)

- c. David also commanded the leaders of Israel to help Solomon (<u>1 Ch. 22:17-19</u>)
- d. Solomon made a treaty with Hiram, king of Tyre, which secured lumber for the temple (1 Kgs. 5:1-12)
- e. Solomon raised a labor force to prepare lumber and stones for the temple (1 Kgs. 5:13-18)
- 2. Construction (1 Kgs. 6-7)
  - a. Solomon had the temple constructed which took seven years (1 Kgs. 6:38)
  - b. All the necessary furnishings and decorations of the temple were constructed and installed (<u>1 Kgs. 7:15-51</u>)
- 3. Dedication (1 Kgs. 8)
  - a. The ark of the covenant of the LORD was brought into the completed temple (1 Kgs. 8:1-9)
  - b. The glory of the LORD filled the temple (1 Kgs. 8:10-11)
  - c. Solomon dedicated the temple (1 Kgs. 8:12-66)
    - i. Solomon connected the temple with the fear of the LORD (<u>1 Kgs. 8:35-43</u>)
    - ii. The church is the temple today (<u>1 Cor. 3:16-17</u>, <u>6:19</u>; <u>2 Cor. 6:16-18</u>; <u>Eph.</u> <u>2:19-22</u>)
    - iii. God prepared, constructed, and dedicated the church (<u>Eph. 3:9-11</u>; <u>Mt. 16:18-19</u>; <u>Gal. 4:4-5</u>; <u>Ac. 2</u>; 1 Pt. 2:5)

## Conclusion

- 1. Solomon teaches us that the fear of the LORD and wisdom go together
  - a. Let us be those that operate with the wisdom of God and as such fear Him
- 2. Solomon connected the fear of the LORD with the temple
  - a. The church is the temple today and so we must be those that fear the LORD
