- 2. God is the Great Giver of all that is good (Jm. 1:17)

  - a. Cain and Abel (Gen. 4:1-5; Heb. 11:4)
  - b. Noah (Gen. 8:20-22)
  - c. Jacob (Gen. 28:20-22)
  - d. Law of Moses (Lev. 1-3; Dt. 12:5-6, 26:1-11; Pr. 3:9-10)
  - e. New Testament (<u>Lk. 6:38</u>; <u>Heb. 13:16</u>; <u>2 Cor. 8-9</u>; <u>1 Cor. 16:1-2</u>; <u>Rm. 12:1</u>; <u>1</u> <u>Pt. 2:5</u>)
- 2. Supports the work and workers of God
  - a. Levites (Num. 18:23-32)
  - b. Preacher (1 Cor. 9:7-14)
  - c. Elders (<u>1 Tim. 5:17-18</u>)
  - d. Benevolence (Gal. 6:10; Acts 2:44-45, 4:34-35; Rm. 15:26-27)
  - e. Evangelism (Phil. 4:14-18)
  - f. Edification (<u>Eph. 4:11-16</u>)
- 3. Guards against selfishness (<u>Job 31:16-22</u>; <u>Pr. 11:25-26</u>, <u>21:26</u>; <u>Rm. 12:8</u>; <u>Ex. 25:1-8</u> with <u>Ex. 35:21-29</u>, <u>36:5-7</u>; <u>1 Chr. 29:6-9</u>)
- 4. Teaches dependence on God (Dt. 8:18; Mt. 6:11, 31-33)
- 5. Teaches trust in God (<u>1 Tim. 6:17</u>; <u>Pr. 23:4-5</u>)
- 6. Glorifies God (<u>1 Chr. 16:28-29</u>)
- 7. Shows our love for God and others (<u>2 Cor. 8:24</u>; <u>2 Chr. 24:4-14</u>)

## **Understanding That Giving is to Be Sacrificial**

1. David understood to give something that did not cost is no giving at all (2 Sam. 24:24; 1 Chr. 21:24)

- a. He paid 600 shekels of gold for the place (plot, parcel, of ground) equivalent to ~15.2 lbs or \$276,000 (1 Chr. 21:25)
  - i. This plot of land was where the temple was erected (2 Chr. 3:1)
- b. He paid 50 shekels of silver for the threshingfloor and the oxen equivalent to  $\sim$ 1.3 lbs or \$287.50 (2 Sam. 24:24)
- c. God accepted His offering (2 Sam. 24:25; 1 Chr. 21:26-28)
  - i. Why not Cain's offering? (Gen. 4:5-7; Heb. 11:4)
- 2. This principle of sacrificial giving is illustrated with the poor widow (Mk. 12:41-44; Lk. 21:1-4)
  - a. Who got the better deal in spending their livelihood? (<u>Lk. 8:43</u> with <u>Mk. 12:44; Lk. 21:4</u>)
- 3. On the other side is giving to God what does not cost us (Mal. 1:6-14, 3:8-12)
  - a. How shameful and sinful this is!

## Conclusion

- 1. Jesus said giving was more blessed than receiving (Acts 20:35)
  - a. If we truly believe that we will have no issues with our giving
  - b. We will give God what is right and will be blessed because of it
- 2. "And the king said unto Araunah, Nay; but I will surely buy *it* of thee at a price: neither will I offer burnt offerings unto the Lord my God of that which doth cost me nothing. So David bought the threshingfloor and the oxen for fifty shekels of silver." (2 Sam. 24:24)
  - a. Let us be those that give God what is right in accordance with His Word
